Lifeline Free Phone Program

Lifeline is a public assistance program that offers qualified, low-income customers a **free phone** or **discount** on their wireless monthly telephone bill depending on your eligibility. The Free Phone program offers free phone services including free limited airtime and limited text messages. The aim of the Lifeline program is to ensure that everyone has a cell phone since it has become a necessity of modern life. A phone helps in emergencies and aides with employment opportunities. A phone is a link to the outside world, but many low-income families find it difficult to afford a phone and pay monthly bills. Lifeline helps such families by offering free cell phones and limited phone services.

You may qualify for the Lifeline Program in New York, if you participate in one of the following programs:

- SNAP- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
- SSI- Supplemental Social Security Income
- **HEAP**-Home Energy Assistance Program
- Medicaid * Temporary Assistance * Section 8 * National School Lunch
