d) Report by the TIP Subcommittee on Progress Regarding the Development of the UCTC 2014-2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) update: The UCTC is beginning to develop its 2014-2018 Transportation Improvement Program update. On October 23rd, the UCTC TIP Subcommittee met with our NYSDOT Regional Planning and Program Manager to discuss future estimated federal and state funding targets for MPOs in Region 8. Significant restructuring of the UCTC TIP will be required in order to maintain fiscal constraint during the 2014-2018 TIP cycle. An update on this process will be provided to members.

e): Highway Safety Improvement Program Funds - FFY13/FFY14 Project Solicitation. During the MAP-21 program period (FFY 13-14) NYSDOT will be using approximately \$42M from FFY 13 and \$43M from FFY 14 in available HSIP funds for centrally managed proposals to be selected statewide. This statewide solicitation will be used to support safety specific projects that direct safety funds where they are most needed by targeting locations, corridors, or areas demonstrating the highest benefit-cost ratios to reduce fatal and severe injury crashes. Funding will be awarded based on an evaluation of these projects to maximize investment in the most

cost-effective safety projects. Successful proposals will be consistent with the strategies and emphasis areas identified in the NYS Strategic Highway Safety Plan.

The National Scenic Byways Program is part of the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration. Established in Title 23, Section 162 of the United States Code under the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 and reauthorized and expanded significantly in 1998 under TEA-21 and again under SAFETEA-LU in 2005, the program is a grass-roots collaborative effort established to help recognize, preserve and enhance selected roads throughout the United States.

NYSDOT Safe Routes to School Award. In May New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) announced that applications are available for \$23.9 million in federal Safe Routes to School (SRTS) funding for infrastructure improvements and public education campaigns across the State to encourage elementary and middle school children to safely walk and bike to school. SRTS applications have been reviewed by committee members; recommendations have been forwarded to NYSDOT officials.

<u>UPWP 44.23.02-01 – Initiate a Study of the Need and Location for an Intermodal Facility to Serve the Greater New Paltz Area</u>: In August, UCTC and UCAT staff met with local officials from the Village of New Paltz to discuss the initiation of this part-consultant project totaling \$80k. A draft work plan and RFP was created based on project goals as identified in the UPWP as well as from local input. The RFP for the hiring of a consultant was submitted to the Ulster County Purchasing Department for review in October; it will be published as soon as that review is completed.

<u>UPWP 44.23.02-02 – Ulster County Safe Routes To School Demonstration Project</u>. UCTC will initiate a SRTS demonstration project that will work with two local municipalities to provide an analysis of any significant gaps and safety issues on routes to critical schools. On October 3rd UCTC staff sent an electronic solicitation for project participation to all municipalities in Ulster County. The deadline for submission was extended to November 7th due to Hurricane Sandy; three applications were received (Towns of Lloyd and Shawangunk and a joint application from New Paltz Village/Town). UCTC staff will review applications in late November/early December and notify awardees shortly thereafter. Concurrently, a draft RFP for consultant services to conduct the work will be submitted to Ulster County Purchasing for review. Project website: http://www.co.ulster.ny.us/planning/srts.html

<u>UPWP 42.23.02-04 – Boices Lane Rail Safety Project.</u> The purpose of this study is to assess the traffic operations and safety at the existing railroad crossing on Boices Lane, Town of Ulster, including the adjacent intersections with Morton Boulevard and John Clark Drive, and to evaluate alternatives to reduce congestion and address safety issues identified as part of the study. Creighton Manning Engineering and Planning Consultants were hired to conduct the work; an initial Technical Advisory Committee meeting was held on 9/17 at the Town of Ulster offices to review the Project Objective, Approach and Scope of Work. Inventory, mapping, and analysis of existing and future traffic conditions is presently underway; a walk-through of the site by TAC members is scheduled for 11/20/12. <u>UPWP 44.26.14/44.26.15 – Ulster County Transit System Coordination and Development Plan:</u> Nelson/Nygaard Consulting Associates along with Fitzgerald & Halliday, Inc. are working as the consultants on the project. The draft final report was delivered to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) in September 2012. The report provides an overview of general transit service principles recommended for implementation by both Ulster County transit agencies to improve passenger experience as well as proposed service changes. The TAC has reviewed the report and provided revisions to the consultants. The final report will be presented in a public forum, likely to be scheduled for January at the City of Kingston Common Council Chambers. <u>Staffing:</u> The position of Transportation Planner formally held by Sweta Basnet has been vacant since September 14th. A job posting advertising the position was circulated to local, regional and national websites and other public forums in September. A total of 24 applications were

received and 6 interviews were conducted during October and November 2012 by UCTC and Ulster County Planning staff. A conditional offer of employment has been submitted to the preferred candidate and is pending at this time contingent upon completion of the criminal background investigation process by Ulster County Personnel Department.

<u>Draft Final SFY 2011-12 Financial Report and SFY12-13 First Quarter Report:</u> The Draft Final Financial Report for SFY11-12 is attached for review (p 7). All reimbursement requests have been fulfilled by NYSDOT with receipts totaling \$279,992.90 during the 2011-2012 reporting period.

A reimbursement submission to NYSDOT for the first quarter SFY 2012-13 (April 1, 2012 – June 30, 2012) was submitted to NYSDOT for review on October 17, 2012. Reimbursement in the amount of \$88,536.64 was requested for work performed during this period. A full update of SFY 2012-13 submissions and receipts will be provided at the next meetings of the UCTC Technical and Policy Committees.
