

Proposed Local Law No. 8 Of 2013

County Of Ulster

A Local Law Amending Local Law No. 10 of 2008 (A Local Law Adopting An Administrative Code for the County of Ulster, State of New York) To Delete Administrative Code Language As A Result Of Charter Revision Through Local Law No. 9 of 2012 (A Local Law Amending the Ulster County Charter)

BE IT ENACTED, by the Legislature of the County of Ulster, as follows:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT AND FINDINGS.

The Ulster County Legislature adopted Local Law No. 9 of 2012 (A Local Law Amending the Ulster County Charter) on August 14, 2012. Revisions to §C-29 of the Charter established a specific procedure for determining the term of office for an Acting County Executive. The procedure adopted in the Amended Charter supersedes the procedure which was established by the Administrative Code. The Legislature hereby amends §A3-8 C of the Administrative Code as follows:

The following language is hereby deleted in its entirety from §A3-8 C of the Ulster County Administrative Code:

“The Acting County Executive shall hold office until and including the 31st day of December succeeding the first annual election at which the vacancy can be filled by election. A vacancy occurring in the office of County Executive before the 20th day of September of any year shall be filled at the next general election as provided by the Public Officers Law.”

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, provision, or part thereof, in this local law, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, is adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the local law or the validity of the local law as a whole or any sections, provision or part thereof, not so adjudged invalid or unconstitutional and the application of the local law or any section, provision or part thereof to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected by said adjudication.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

This law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.
