1) RESOLUTIONS

Resolution No. 99 – Setting A Public Hearing On Introductory Local Law No. 4 Of 2009 (Enacting “Lynette’s Law” - A Local Law Establishing A Charge Of Aggravated Harassment For The Throwing, Tossing Or Expelling Of Bodily Fluids On Residents Of Ulster County) To Be Held On Wednesday, May 6, 2009 At 6:15 PM

Motion offered by Legislator Cahill, seconded by Legislator Zimet.

Counsel Heppner recommended referral to the Criminal Justice Committee because the local law refers to a felony conviction, and the County doesn’t have the authority to make that determination. Legislator Zimet expressed concern about the stigma attached to having Lynette’s name on the law. She requested that D. Heppner attend the next Criminal Justice Committee meeting.

Motion not voted upon.

Resolution No. 135 – Authorizing The Chairman Of The Ulster County Legislature To Execute A License Agreement or Memorandum of Understanding With The New York State Division of Parole For The Use Of Space In The Former County Jail On Golden Hill, Kingston, New York
