Discussion/Approval of Minutes

Dave Haldeman made a motion to approve the minutes from the March 29, 2023. They were approved unanimously.

Introduction of Speaker/Presentation

Eleanor Peck of the Hudson Valley Regional Council <u>https://hudsonvalleyregionalcouncil.org/</u> spoke about the Climate Smart Community Program and clean energy initiatives. In New York State, 118 communities have been certified as Bronze or Silver Climate Smart communities. Department of the Environment Update

Energy, Environment and Sustainability Committee

Ted Griese reported that he most recent meeting of the energy and environment committee focused on solid waste issues. The town of Plattekill has registered strong opposition to landfill citing there. Efforts are underway to reduce the waste stream.

Resource Recovery

Bill More again discussed the proposal he has drawn up for a hazardous waste disposal program targeted for small quantity hazardous waste generated by businesses, schools, town, garages, etc. He proposes that it take place on the Friday before the regular Saturday household hazardous waste collection program. Bill and Dave Haldeman will compose a letter to the UCRRA and UC Legislature to urge adoption of this program

Bill More said that DEC has hired a contractor to design a management plan to alleviate overuse of the Kaaterskill Falls and Blue Hole areas in the Catskills. Town of Shawangunk Dave Haldeman	• Shawangunk is considering a development proposal for the 700 acre Blue Chip Farm. Dave wondered if we can collectively create a list of environmental issues that should be included in the environmental impact assessment for every UC development e.g.: planting of native species, lighting, provision of EV charging stations and renewable energy sources, impervious surfaces, vehicular traffic impacts, etc.
City of Kingston Ted Griese	 Kingston was recently awarded a \$270,000 grant to build 2 fast charging stations Kingston was also awarded a \$21 million grant for shoreline stabilization and waterfront improvement
Town of Saugerties Leslie Surprenant	 Saugerties continues to work towards Climate Smart re-certification and a Community Choice power aggregation project Leslie is leading an effort to study the effects of aquatic vegetation removal from the Esopus Creek and hopes to correlate that with measures of turbidity in the Creek Saugerties continues to consider Development plans for Winston Farms.
