

#### Goals of the Task Force

3 Recommended <u>Action Items</u> each <u>in the areas</u> of <u>Reducing Supply</u>, <u>Reducing Demand</u>, <u>and Improving Treatment and Recovery Services</u>,

that if implemented, would Reduce Opioid Overdoses and Fatalities in UC by 50% in 2 Years

#### How this Gets Done

- Review existing programs and practices in UC + research Best and Promising Practices in other communities
- Identify gaps in the system that impact effectiveness and that allow for people to "fall into the cracks" that lead to addiction, overdose, relapse
- Evaluate, prioritize, develop action plan
- Implement and measure


#### Which Action(s) to Move Forward?

- Return on Investment if implemented will it have a significant impact on the overall goal of reducing opioid overdoses and fatalities in Ulster County by 50% in 2 years?
- Is it realistic and doable, given all available community resources (collective impact of all sectors, monetary and non-monetary)?
- How long will it take to produce results? (2-year maximum)
- Can the idea/action be developed and presented in a compelling and convincing way, such that organizational and overall community leadership can fully support and buy in to?
- Can progress/results be measured, and how?

# What About the Good Ideas That Don't Make it to the Top 3?

- They should be included in the final report as Additional Promising Actions that merit further research and development for possible future implementation
- 2. There should be another category noted, known as "Quick Fixes". These are the things that can be done NOW to make improvements in a given area, without having to identify funding or establish a lengthy review/approval process (i.e. getting the right people in a room and making it happen!)
