SFY 2017 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

The Ulster County Transportation Council (UCTC) is inviting public review and comment on the draft SFY 2017 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for the Ulster County Metropolitan Planning Area.

UCTC is responsible for the development of an annual UPWP. The UPWP sets priorities for transportation-related planning activities of UCTC and includes the funding levels for projects for the upcoming year. The UPWP must support the goals, objectives and recommendations of UCTC's Year 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan and be compliant with the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, the latest federal surface transportation act signed into law on December 4, 2015.

The Ulster County Transportation Council (UCTC) is the state designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Ulster County and a portion of the Poughkeepsie-Newburgh Urbanized Area. The UCTC was designated by the Governor of New York as the MPO for the Kingston Urbanized Planning Area on April 30, 2003. The UCTC was formally organized with the adoption of Operating Procedures on June 4, 2003. The purpose of the UCTC is to build a consensus on local and regionally significant transportation, transit and non-motorized improvements.
