1. RUPCO, Inc.

a. Ulster County Coordinated Entry

Project Description: RUPCO is submitting a proposal to request funds to support the development and implementation of the HUD required Coordinated Entry. RUPCO will serve as the lead agency in the Ulster County Coordinated Entry.

b. Ulster County CoC Planning Project

Project Description: RUPCO requests funds to support the operations of the CoC. Proposed funds will support coordination and facilitation of the CoC's processes; including strengthening the current CoC system, assisting with the development and implementation of a coordinated assessment system, project evaluation and monitoring, conducting an annual gaps analysis and Point-in-Time Count, participating in the Consolidated Plan, and preparing and submitting the CoC's application to HUD

2. PEOPLE Inc.

a. PEOPLE Home Again Project 2 FY18

Project Description: PEOPLE Home Again Project 2 will increase the number of dedicated beds for chronically homeless individuals and families. The target population for this program will serve those that have been diagnosed with serious and persistent mental illness or co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders. The proposed project will follow a "Housing First" model, ensuring that program participants are housed as quickly as possible; their needs are met through an available menu of services. Ongoing supports (coordinated through continuous assessments) will be provided either directly by PEOPLE, Inc. or through community linkages to an integrated network of collaborating partner-providers throughout the service area.

3. Family of Woodstock Inc.

a. UCCOC Domestic Violence Coordinated Entry Lead

Project Description: Family of Woodstock Inc., operates the Domestic Violence Shelter and coordinated support services for victims of domestic violence and their families. The project will provide dedicated staff to coordinate and lead in the development and implementation of the Ulster CoC's Domestic Violence Coordinated entry.

1. Family of Woodstock

a. HUD Midway (2018)

Grant PIN: 0541

Project Description: The HUD MidWay Transitional living program provides safe shelter and support services for 12 homeless adolescents 16-20 who have no family supports, and when necessary their babies. The program has two sites, each licensed to serve up to 6 adolescents and 3 babies. Youth are supported to resume or complete their education, gain

life and job readiness skills, address issues that are holding them back such as mental illness, substance abuse and/or legal or health issues and become employed.

b. HUD S & C Families (2018)

Grant PIN: 0646

Project Description: This program provides 9 units of permanent supportive housing and ongoing support to homeless families of which at least one adult has a history of chronic substance abuse, mental health or physical disability. The project provides case management services to address the long-term issues that led to the family's homelessness and provide life skills training and skill building to assist family members to build vocational skills and independence.

c. HUD S & C SRO (2018)

Grant PIN: 0755

Project Description: This program provides sponsor based rental assistance for 24 homeless individuals. This multi-site SRO housing and support program will serve all of Ulster County. This population includes chronically homeless individuals, all of whom will have a disability including young adults, veterans, sex-offenders, mentally ill, or chemically dependent, as well as persons living with HIV/AIDS and victims of domestic violence.

d. HUD SHP Families (2018) (part of consolidated grant)

Grant PIN: 0647

Project Description: SHP Families program provides seven units of PSH for homeless families. This program will provide rental subsidies and support services for families who were previously homeless and in which the head of household had a disability. The apartments will be scattered throughout Ulster County and the rent for them will in part be underwritten by this grant, with the additional funding coming from either the Public Assistance Living Allowance, or 30% of the household's income. The funds will be used to provide case management services to address the long-term issues that led to the family's homelessness and provide life skills training and skill building to assist family members to build vocational skills and independence.

e. HUD SHP Families II (2018) (part of consolidated grant)

Grant PIN: 0868

Project Description: SHP Families program provides fifteen units (34 beds) of PSH for homeless families. This program will provide rental subsidies and support services for families who were previously homeless and in which the head of household had a disability. The apartments will be scattered throughout Ulster County and the rent for them will in part be underwritten by this grant, with the additional funding coming from either the Public Assistance Living Allowance, or 30% of the household's income. The funds will be used to provide case management services to address the long-term issues that led to the family's homelessness and provide life skills training and skill building to assist family members to build vocational skills and independence.

- f. *HUD SHP Families Consolidation Program (2018)*
Grant PIN: 0647

Project Description: This is a consolidation of two Supportive Housing Programs that serve the same population. The consolidated SHP Families program provides 21 units of PSH for homeless families. This program will provide rental subsidies and support services for families who were previously homeless and in which the head of household had a disability. The apartments will be scattered throughout Ulster County and the rent for them will in part be underwritten by this grant, with the additional funding coming from either the Public Assistance Living Allowance, or 30% of the household's income. The funds will be used to provide case management services to address the long-term issues that led to the family's homelessness and provide life skills training and skill building to assist family members to build vocational skills and independence.

- g. *RRH for Domestic Violence Survivors (2018)*
Grant PIN: 1128

Project Description: The Rapid Re-housing for domestic violence survivors provides 5 units located throughout Ulster County for survivors of domestic and dating violence, sexual assault and stalking. The apartments will be scattered site and the locations will be determined based upon the individual or family's safety, and availability of transportation to access services, training and employment. The sizes of the units will vary based upon need, and will serve 5 families, with a total of 12 individuals. All adults in the program will be provided trauma counseling as needed; and assistance to develop an individual services plan with appropriate support services.

- h. *RRH for Families (2018)*
Grant PIN: 1181

Project Description: The Rapid Re-housing for families provides 6 units located throughout Ulster County rental subsidies and support services for families who were previously homeless. This program will be provided trauma counseling as needed; and assistance to develop an individual services plan with appropriate support services.

2. PEOPLE, Inc.

- a. *Home Again Project (2018)*
Grant PIN: 0795

Project Description: PEOPLE's Home Again project is a permanent supportive housing (PSH) program for chronically homeless individuals and families. The project provides 5 units of scattered site housing serving chronically homeless with serious and persistent mental illnesses and/or substance abuse issues. The program utilizes the Housing First Model. Support services are provided in a cross system collaborating/partnership with community providers to deliver services that are trauma informed and recovery based. Participants are encouraged to make choices about their recovery promoting empowerment to move towards independence and overall wellness. The PEOPLE's Home Again project staff also offer peer delivered services that focus on fostering recovery, community self-help meetings, social opportunities, vocational and volunteer opportunities, entitlement education and the development of Change plans that help people maintain wellness.

3. CARES, Inc. (Corporation for AIDS Research, Education and Services, Inc.)*b. Ulster CoC HMIS (2018)***Grant PIN: 0540**

Project Description: Ulster CoC HMIS is a participant in the CARES Regional Homeless Management Information System operated by CARES, Inc. to ensure an unduplicated count of homeless persons within the Coe, providing technical assistance, HMIS helpdesk, systems analysis, user support, reporting (AHAR, ESG CAPER, Quarterly/Annual reporting etc.) and training on both the HMIS data standards and software.

4. Rehabilitation Support Services*c. OASAS Shelter Plus Care (2018)***Grant PIN: 0542**

Project Description: This project is a 16 unit scattered site PSH program with sponsor based, rental assistance program in Ulster County. The program provides housing rent subsidy and case management services for both for individuals as well as families. This program is in its 16th year of operation. Participants must be homeless and have a primary diagnosis of substance abuse, be enrolled in a drug or alcohol recovery program that meets on a weekly basis and take part in Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) or Narcotics Anonymous (NA). Multi-County provides case management services including serving as representative payee for those who need money management services. Case Coordinators make referrals to drug treatment centers, mental health services, medical services, and pre-vocational training. They advocate for entitlements, e.g., food stamps, Public Assistance and SSI/SSD, when appropriate. Participants may receive aftercare treatment and additional services from other local agencies.

5. Gateway Community Industries*d. WWC (2018)***Grant PIN: 0543**

Project Description: This program provides three units of PSH that includes outreach, life skills, housing, and support services to homeless families with children with the adult having severe mental illness. This project is a six-bed permanent supported housing project with Intend to provide supports to the head of household in areas of employment so the adult can become more self-sufficient.


