<u>ULSTER COUNTY PLANNING BOARD</u> *Minutes – Wednesday, April 3, 2019*

Board Orientation at 6:30 PM

Chairman Calimano called the meeting to order and Mr. Leibowitz read the roll call

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The March minutes were approved as submitted. Motion by Ms. Pecora, seconded by Mr. Konior. All were in favor.

3. EDUCATION & TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Mr. Doyle stated that training opportunities from Dutchess and Orange Counties were emailed out to the board. Mr. Baden stated that the Dutchess County seminar still has room to register anyone that is interested.

4. COMMUNITY REPORTS

Mr. Wilkin stated he asked for the schedule of fees that Planning Department staff collected from around the county and they were emailed to him. He added that there is a lot of information.

Dan Proctor asked what comprises a community report. Chairman Calimano stated it is a general term for what is going around in the members' local municipality. Mr. Doyle added it could be grant applications or something interesting to the board on an educational level. Mr. Leibowitz stated that it could be a new project in your community.

Ms. Lanzetta stated Marlborough is trying to set up an opportunity to have County Planning come down and speak to the local boards. She added that they would like to extend the invitation to local board members in the Southern Tier of Ulster County as well.

Mr. McLaughlin shared that some of the Fire Chiefs in Saugerties have expressed frustration with open burns going on around the County. He added that there is presently an open burning ban until May 15th.

Chairman Calimano noted that this is the end of the first quarter so mileage reimbursements are due and blank forms are available.

b. <u>Committee Reports</u>

Mr. Baden updated the Board on the Rules & Procedures, which wereadopted June 5, 2013. These updated rules show that the Secretary can perform all duties of the Chair & Vice Chair in their absence. It also addresses the membership of the Executive Committee. Mr. Badded added that Mr. Murray pointed out the start time of the meeting is incorrect. We may want to delete the sentence pertaining to start time. Also the Order of Business is not in the same order as we currently follow, which sentence could also be deleted. Mr. Baden offered to redo that portion of the rules. Chairman Calimano stated we could look at that section and get back to it.

6. PLANNING DEPARTMENT REPORTS

a. Financial Report

Mr. Doyle stated we are working on criteria for accessing the funding related to trail maintenance issues in our budget. The Transportation Council's Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) runs on the State Fiscal Year and was approved at both the State and Federal levels in March. We will be undertaking four major studies as part of that UPWP this year. Mr. Doyle noted that we currently have an intern in the office doing some sidewalk work. We also have responsibilities to work on a Long Range Transportation plan in order to meet federal requirements as an MPO. Mr. Samuelson is putting together a draft outline application to the state to update the County's Ag Farmland Protection Plan.

Ms. Lanzetta asked if there was news about TAP (Transportation Alternatives Program)? Mr. Doyle answered we have heard no news about the awards, and are hoping to see another application come out soon.

d. <u>Director/Staff Reports</u>

Mr. Leibowitz stated the follow-up for the Brownfield's Opportunity Area study will be to have the communities comment on the documents once we receive them. Mr. Baden asked to see the draft documents.

7. SPECIAL TOPICS DISCUSSION

Mr. Doyle spoke about the Bus Integration effort and noted the result would be a single bus system if this occurs. He added that we are working to expand and change bus routes within the city and anticipate that changes will be more efficient. Mr. McLaughlin asked if there was any plan to layoff drivers from the City. Mr. Doyle answered that from the County's perspective we will need all the drivers. Mr. Gagliardi asked if the City will have to come to the County for special festival service. Mr. Doyle answered that the County has a festival policy that includes payment of operating cost. The City may have some remaining buses to provide service.

Mr. Wilkin asked if the County will be doing traffic counts soon. Mr. Doyle answered that we have contracted with Tri-State Traffic Data and planned on doing spring

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counts, but don't have a date yet. If not spring, counts will be done in the fall. He added that the County will also be doing camera counts associated with a traffic study and trail counts.
