  - a) <u>Draft Resolution 2014–11: Amendment to the UCTC 2014 2018 Transportation</u> <u>Improvement Program.</u> Draft Resolution 2014-11 establishes PIN 878049, programming federal Transportation Enhancement Program funds for the City of Kingston to construct pedestrian and bicycle facilities on the Broadway Corridor from Broadway at St. James Street to Foxhall Avenue. Streetscape improvements and enhancements will include facilities such as sidewalks, curbing, bike lanes, pedestrian bumpouts, lighting, benches and trees. The total project cost is \$3.250m, utilizing a local share of \$1.249m.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Discuss Resolution 2014-11 and forward to the UCTC Policy Committee for Approval.

b) <u>Ulster County Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) Action Plan</u>: The effects of the EAB infestation in Ulster County are rapidly becoming visible and handling the clean-up will soon become a reality that the Department of Public Works (DPW) will have to address along rights-of-way and at County facilities. Staff from the Ulster County Department of the Environment will present on findings of the draft *Ulster County Emerald Ash Borer Action Plan* and discuss implications that the infestation will have on the transportation network. Technical Committee members are encouraged to bring members of their highway departments and departments of public works to learn more.

Recommended Action: For information and discussion purposes only. (30 minutes).

c) Amendments to the UCTC SFY2014 Unified Planning Work Program: At the September 23, 2014 joint meeting of the UCTC Technical and Policy Committees, the Technical Committee authorized staff to amend various tasks in the 2014 UPWP by up to \$50,000 total utilizing unallocated FHWA PL funds. Two task budget amendments were made to the 2014 program totaling \$27,758, which are outlined in the agenda supplement 5a.

Recommended Action: For information and discussion purposes only. (10 minutes).

d) <u>Update of UCTC Operating Procedures.</u> A first-draft of proposed modifications to the UCTC Operating Procedures was circulated at the September 23<sup>rd</sup> Tech/Policy meeting. Staff will review and discuss these proposed revisions and open the floor to discussion regarding these and any other revisions proposed by Technical Committee members.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Discuss proposed changes to the UCTC Operating Procedures; based on comments, staff will prepare a 2<sup>nd</sup> draft for review at the next Technical Committee meeting. (20 minutes)

e) NYS Route 212 Town of Woodstock. The deteriorating state of Rt 212 from Bearsville to Mt. Tremper has been a point of discussion by the UCTC Technical Committee over the past several months. The 2014 NYSDOT Region 8 paving schedule included limited work to address some of the problems along segments of Rt 212. At the request of the Town of Woodstock, the subject of the current condition of Rt 212 and how it may be addressed will be discussed.

f) NYSDOT Region 8 Local Project Unit Staffing and MPO STIP Performance: NYSDOT Region 8 staff would like to introduce Martin Evans as the new regional Local Project Liaison (RLPL). Mr. Evans will be present to discuss local project schedules in regard to STIP Performance and the NYSDOT Regional Director's Commitment List.
