<u>ULSTER COUNTY PLANNING BOARD</u> Minutes – Wednesday, September 6, 2023

The Executive Committee Did Not Meet

Chairman Boggess called the meeting to order and Mr. Leibowitz read the roll call

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The August 2nd minutes were approved. Motion made by Mr. Wilkin, seconded by Mr. Watkins. All were in favor.

3. EDUCATION & TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Mr. Baden stated the NY Planning Federation will be in Hyde Park next Tuesday. Mr. Doyle stated we have a training coming up next month on Wetlands. Mr. Baden stated the date is October 23rd. Mr. Doyle said we will send out the details to the Board. Mr. Boggess stated he has been participating in the Planning Federations lunch and learn and he found it interesting.

4. COMMUNITY REPORTS

Mr. Baden thanked the Planning Department, stating that members of Town of Rochester Housing Commission met with Mr. Lord-Farmer and have selected a consultant to identify areas of the community for housing. He added that Rochester will receive between \$35,000-\$40,000 worth of funding from the County for this effort.

Mr. Watkins stated Blue Chip has submitted their draft scope for positive dec.

Mr. Boggess stated Town of Olive's zoning map is from 1975 and has never been altered. He noted that Heidi Emrich, who is on Olive's planning board and works for the County, has taken that map and digitized it. Mr. Boggess added they aren't changing anything, just modernizing it.

5. PLANNING BOARD REPORTS

- a. Chairperson Report
 Chairman Boggess stated it is the end of the 3rd quarter, so mileage is due. Mr.
 Wilkin noted that you can send the forms in digitally now.

6. PLANNING DEPARTMENT REPORTS

a. Financial Report

Mr. Doyle stated we have been through our first round of budget work and have submitted something similar to last year. He added that we requested an increase in

funds for housing and have put in a request for title changes for some of the staff to reflect what they are doing more accurately. We have not heard anything from the County Executive's staff on the submittal and it will be reviewed by the Legislature for their comments/changes. The final budget will go to the Legislature for approval in December. Our Board will be reviewing the Capital Programming Budget again this year, which is required under the Charter. Mr. Doyle also gave an update on the trails and transportation projects. He noted the Affordable Rental Upgrade Program (ARUP) will be rolling out shortly, the ADU (Accessory Dwelling Unit) program has been receiving applications and we have been discussing extending the ADU program submittal date. He added there were over 20 submittals for the ADU design contest. The Legislature recently approved using \$15 million of the assigned fund balance for the housing action fund. We are in the process of setting up a committee and will put out a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) to make up to \$3 million available for housing purposes on a yearly basis. Mr. Doyle stated he believed staff are at their limit for what can be done.

Mr. Doyle made note of the iPark 87 Lead Agency document and added we will be having a gateway meeting with them soon. Ms. Welton asked if the project site would be reviewed in any particular order. Mr. Doyle stated we don't know what the phasing is.

d. Director/Staff Reports - No Reports

7. SPECIAL TOPICS DISCUSSION

NYS Constitutional Amendment – The "Green Amendment"

Mr. Doyle informed the Board that in November 2021 the people of the State of NY voted for the "green amendment" for clean air, water and a healthful environment. This has now been looked at in lower courts as having significant effects. Mr. Doyle spoke about a Supreme Court Case in Monroe County, NY where NYS DEC had been a reluctant participant in permitting for a large landfill and was sued by the neighbors. The Judge said the neighbors did not have to first exhaust administrative solutions; they could instead force the State to implement the green amendment portion of the Constitution. Mr. Doyle stated that we have been asked to analyze and provide comment on this amendment as it could impact local decisions. He advised the Board to Google "green amendment and case decisions" to learn more.

8. PUBLIC COMMENT

Michael North from North Engineers representing the Pine Hill Mobil stated a few people have raised questions about providing detail on the project. He added there is a lot of work to be done, but you can't do work without a permit. He offered to answer questions about the project.

Savannah Jordan, a resident of Rosendale representing Montauk Catch Club, described it as a New England style clam shack that has been operating in several different counties and farmer's markets since 2020. She stated that she is a CIA graduate, and her business partner is a fisherman. They will be renovating a building on Route 32 and making it into a retail seafood company with fresh fish and cooked food.

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Andrew Messinger, a resident of Pine Hill wanted to comment on the proposed AeroStar petroleum station in Pine Hill. His observation was the community generally supports the project but would like the site to be safe and in keeping with the municipal code and would like to have the site become a valued addition to the hamlet. There are concerns about parking, traffic accidents, lighting, community character and environmental stress. He stated the applicant has told the Olive Planning Board that DOT has no objections, but he has not seen that in writing. He noted that the Town code which allows for hiring outside consultants, is being resisted by the Town Planning Board even though it would be at no cost to town. Mr. Messenger asked the County to offer quidance to the town on this project.

9. ZONING REFERRALS – See Separate Zoning Minutes

The Chairman asked to have the Rosendale and Olive referrals reviewed first.

10. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at 8:30 PM. All were in favor.
