- **"The Thanks of the Nation": We Honor and Remember Ulster County's Civil War Veterans** In recognition of the 150th anniversary of the Civil War, Nina Postupack, Ulster County Clerk is proud to present to the public and exhibit titled, *"The Thanks of the Nation: We Honor and Remember Ulster County's Civil War Veterans*. When visiting the exhibit you will be taken back in time to the years in and around the conclusion of the Civil War in 1865. The exhibit features the discharge papers of seventy-four Veterans who served in various regiments and branches of the Union Forces. The discharge papers of the Veterans who served in the Union Army describe who these men were and, in effect, "paint" a picture of what they looked like, where they were from, and sometimes where they served. Through these documents, these "paper men" come alive again. In addition, visitors to the exhibit can view a timeline of the Civil War and learn about the local regiments and the time period leading up to and through the Civil War. At the Ulster County Office Building, 244 Fair St., 2nd Floor, Kingston, NY. Weekdays during Cultural Heritage Week and until 12/31 from 9am -4:45pm.
- **"The Ashokan Reservoir Collection": An Exhibit and Video Presentation** Nina Postupack, Ulster County Clerk presents a two part event pertaining to the Ashokan Reservoir at the Ulster County Records Center. In commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the complication of the construction of the reservoir, Nina will be presenting an exhibit which will feature samples of the records series that together form the Ashokan Reservoir Collection of Records. These records include Award Transcripts, Court Orders, Orders of Confirmation, Orders Depositing Money, and Section Maps.

The collection is considerable in size, totaling over 100 cubic feet. The Award Transcripts make up the largest part, with 366 volumes of Supreme Court Testimony from property owners' claims against the Commissioners of Appraisal. Of particular interest, the exhibit will show maps from four of the eighteen sections, including Olive Bridge, Olive City, West Shokan and West Hurley. Neighborhoods, streets,

houses, outbuildings, and churches now under water or on the watershed are all drawn in great detail. The maps are paired with samples of testimony from claimants that correspond to parcels illustrated on the maps. Each map has an index page that lists claimants and their parcel numbers. Taking lines are drawn in pink. A microfilm finding aid listing all the claimants in alphabetical order is available at the exhibit.

In addition, visitors will be able to view a 23 minute video presentation that illustrates the dynamic records contained in this collection. These records document the transfer of land from the local inhabitants and also put the viewer back in the court room listening to first person testimony of the claimants who were suing the Board of Water Supply for Additional Compensation.

If you are a descendant of a claimant or interested in reading about the lives and livelihoods of residents of the Esopus River Valley at the turn of the twentieth century, please stop by the Records Center and take a look as we bring a part of the history of the Ashokan Reservoir alive. At the Ulster County Records Center, 300 Foxhall Avenue, Kingston, during **Cultural Heritage Week**, weekdays 10/17 - 10/24 from 9am - 4:45pm.

• "People of Person – Discovering the Van Imbroch Family"- This 2014 Matthewis Persen House exhibit is presented by Nina Postupack, Ulster County Clerk and looks at the Van Imbroch family, the first family to live in the Person House. It invites the visitor to discover who the Van Imbroch's were, where they went and many interesting facts about this family. You will be introduced to Agent 1664 who will guide you through the mystery of discovering the Van Imbroch family. The exhibit features some of the artifacts found in the house that date to the time period of the Van Imbroch's. We wonder if these items belonged to the Van Imbroch family and whether they actually used any of the artifacts in their daily life.

Gysbert Van Imbroch, the father of the family, is said to have had the largest collection of books in the New World! This is known because the Ulster County Clerk's Office has the Inventory of the Van Imbroch's home that was completed upon Gysbert's death in 1665. Copies of the Inventory, as well as copies of the covers of some of these old books will be on exhibit. Come to the Person House and learn about this interesting and remarkable family! Walking Tour of the Byrdcliffe Art Colony and White Pines - Join the spirited Henry T. Ford, Byrdcliffe's Board President, for a moderate walking tour through the more than 100 years of historic buildings and grounds that make up the Byrdcliffe Art Colony. A highlight of the tour is White Pines, built in 1903 as the home of Byrdcliffe founders, Ralph and Jane Whitehead. The streamlined Arts and Crafts style home is beautifully situated on a hilltop offering views of the spectacular Hudson Valley fall foliage. Famous literati like Wallace Stevens, Will Durant and Thomas Mann, naturalist John Burroughs, and dancer Isadora Duncan were all regular visitors to White Pines. Next door to White Pines, visitors will have a glimpse of a contemporary outdoor sculpture exhibition.
