Chairperson Mihm called the meeting to order at 5:11 PM.

Motion No. 1: Motion to Approve the March 9, 2023 Meeting Minutes

Public Comment: None

Chair Mihm recognized Mike Baden, Town of Rochester Supervisor, who inquired about the status of the proposal he made during the March 9th meeting on behalf of the Ulster County Association of Town Supervisors and Mayors relating to reverting to a Board of Supervisors.

Chair Mihm recognized Sheriff Juan Figueroa. The Sheriff raised concerns about having to go through the County Executive's Office for approval on items that were already approved in the budget, such as attending conferences. The Sheriff raised his concern that the County Attorney does not adequately represent elected officials and argued that there are issues relating to conflicts of interest. Commission Members questioned the Sheriff about his concerns. Commission Member Rodriguez suggested creating a pool of candidates for County Attorney from which the County Executive could pick from. The Sheriff stated that a pool would be time-consuming. Commission Member Simonofsky asked whether a provision relating to outsourcing legal counsel would address the Sheriff's concern. Chair Mihm asked whether there was language in the Charter that needs to be changed in regards to the budget issue. The Sheriff responded that it is not in the Charter. Commission Member Rodriguez noted that statutorily the County Attorney is the sole legal advisor to the County.

Chair Mihm recognized Victoria Fabella, Clerk of the Legislature, who advised the Commission that the majority of legislators believed that it would be in the County's best interest for the Commission to take the whole time to issue their report, as opposed to submitting it early to be included on this year's ballot. Assistant County Attorney Williams advised the Commission that once the report is issued, the Commission is dissolved. Commission Member Harris suggested issuing a two-part report and continuing to meet. Assistant County Attorney Williams advised that the Charter contemplates a single report. Commission Member Rodriguez suggested that the Commission could issue informal findings to the Legislature and noted that the Legislature can pass local laws at any time. Commission Members Rodriguez and Kadgen agreed that once the report is issued, the Commission is dissolved. Commission Members discussed the timing of issuing their report and whether their recommendations would go on the ballot in 2023 or 2024.

Clerk Fabella advised the Commission that the Legislature's proposed revisions will be submitted next week and that Chair Bartels is available on May 4th and May 11th. Commission Members discussed timelines and scheduling extra meetings. The Commission decided to schedule extra meetings on Monday, April 10, 2023 at 5 pm and Monday, April 17, 2023 at 5 pm. Additionally, the Commission decided to start its regularly scheduled meeting on Thursday, May 4, 2023 at 4 pm and to dedicate that meeting to the Legislature's proposed revisions.

Commission Member McCarthy asked how to address Sheriff's issues in the Charter. Chair Mihm suggested including observations in the Commission's report where there are not specific proposed revisions. Assistant County Attorney Williams advised the Commission that it is within its power to add new sections to the Charter. First Assistant County Attorney Gumaer requested that the Commission vote in instances when it wishes to formally request that language be drafted by the County Attorney's Office.

The Comptroller and Deputy Comptroller DeMarco advised the Commission that in their opinion no authority exists for conference approvals to go through the County Executive's Office.

The Commission reviewed and discussed Commission Member Tom Kadgen's proposed revisions.

Motion No. 2: Motion to Add Section C-11(K)(2) Relating to the Legislature's

Powers and Duties: "Shall appoint an oversight committee for capital

projects that cumulatively exceed TEN MILLION AND 00/100

(\$10,000,000.00) DOLLARS."
