"The most interesting part of the hearings on county charter change, in my view, was the widespread opposition to dividing towns to meet constitutional one person one vote requirements. Many citizens appear to believe that equal weights given each town in the county advocacy for their towns' interests is needed at the county level, and that having a little bit or even a larger part of several districts is less valuable than being a full district in the county representative body. Citizens in rural and suburban areas seem to think that placed-based representation of towns and their residents is essential."

### **Weighted Vote Example**

## **Example of**Weighted Voting

- Population Percentages
- Range of votes per community based on population percentage of county total
- Establish Quota for Adoption (51%-100%)

#### Two Methods

- Banzhaf Power Index
  - a power index defined by the probability of changing an outcome of a vote where voting rights are not necessarily equally divided among the voters or shareholders.
- Shapely-Shubik Power Index
  - Measures the powers of players in a voting game. The index often reveals surprising power distribution that is not obvious on the surface.


## Closer to the Public
