Dear Ulster County Economic Development Alliance Board.

Below is additional information as requested regarding the approval for CCEUC's invoice.

Overview of Funding Need: For four years CCEUC 4-H has facilitated mentoring programs in Ulster County. We learned in mid- October 2017 that the program for which we were slated to receive program funding would be cut substantially, and no funding would be available after December 31st. In order to not cut off a program in the middle of the school year, we mobilized to generate additional funding including the creation of a GoFundMe account, writing grant/funding requests to Central Hudson, Ulster Saving Charitable Foundation, and Ellenville Million via the Ulster County Economic Development Alliance.

Overview Funding Process with UCEDA: After reading a press release in Nov/Dec 2017 about the uncertainty of the future of the Ellenville Tech Wizards, an Ellenville mentee's parent mentioned the possibility of funding through the Ellenville Million. The Program Leader contacted the Chairperson, who put her in touch with Suzanne Holt. The 4-H Program Leader attended a UCEDA Board meeting in January 2018 where the Committee approved funding of up to \$10,000 with a 1:1 match required.

Overview Programming: The Tech Wizards met biweekly in January and by February were able to reestablish weekly programming. We provided STEM mentoring programming as detailed in the scope of services. In April we hosted a Career Panel for Ellenville Tech Wizards in order to further make the connection to the Ellenville Million's goal of reduced unemployment through teaching youth STEM skills. Programming continued through the summer including attendance at the Ulster County Fair.

what is the subcontract for?

National 4-H Council will only contract with a land-grant university to deliver mentoring programming. Cornell is the land-grant university for NY, but as the Office of Sponsored Programs charges a 59% indirect rate, NYS 4-H negotiated for CCE of Broome County to take over administration of the 4-H National Mentoring Contract to be distributed through them to the 7 participating counties. Amendment #3 to the subcontract provided an additional \$13,000 in funding for Tech Wizards programming that became available from National 4-H Council. This funding wasn't mentioned until late February 2018 (well after notification of program closures etc), with a funding term of Feb 2018-May 31st 2018, and required no discontinuation in programming.

- which services will they be providing?
 The services CCEUC provides are in the scope of services from the original contract listed below:
 Cornell Cooperative Extension Ulster County shall provide the following services, which benefit youth who are residents of Ellenville or Wawarsing:
 - a. 1.5 hours of weekly mentoring provided by or supervised by Cornell's 4-H Youth Educator. All Mentors shall be background and reference checked and required to attend appropriate training;
 - b. Lesson preparation necessary for the mentoring sessions. Lessons shall be focused on STEM content and include, but not be limited to, career exposure and employability, financial literacy, and renewable energy;
 - c. Travel to the program for youth being mentored;
 - d. A Career Exploration Fair hosted by Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County; and
 - e. Provide all necessary supplies.

Please let us know if additional questions arise. We remain so appreciative of the ability you gave us to deliver STEM mentoring to Ellenville youth.


