PRESENTATION:

Chairwoman Tracey Bartels called upon Legislators Kathy Nolan, and Mary Wawro to present a Pride of Ulster County Award to the Woodstock Day School in recognition of winning the annual Project Drawdown Eco-Challenge. Students were up against 1,054 teams, 79 countries and 14,144 participants. The students amassed the most points worldwide, netting the school not just one, but two prizes: Top School and Top Team.

The Project Drawdown Eco-Challenge annual event focuses on carbon reduction, and follows actions highlighted in environmentalist Paul Hawken's bestselling *Drawdown: the most comprehensive plan ever proposed to reverse global warming*. Students engaged in various sustainability-oriented, point-earning actions, tracking and sharing their progress online. Seven challenge categories provided students with diverse options such as efforts to educate girls in developing countries, eating more plants, upcycling, composting, planting trees, eliminating plastic bag usage, and properly disposing of refrigerants.

Joining WDS student Kate Delacorte are mentors, STEM Coordinator Amy Shapiro, Librarian Robin Shornstein and Head of Woodstock Day School, David Penberg.

Carfentanil is used legally for anaesthetizing large animals such as elephants, which is 100 times as strong as fentanyl.
2. Owen Harvey, Kingston: Mr. Owen spoke in opposition to Resolution No. 260, appointing Brad Will to the Ulster County Planning Board – City of Kingston.
3. Michael Davis, Kingston: Mr. Davis is a 20-year employee for the Ulster County 911 Center who spoke in support of Resolution No. 266.
4. Frank Fauble, West Hurley: Mr. Fauble spoke in support of Resolution No. 236 - Fire Training Center.
5. Kevin Smith, Woodstock: Mr. Smith opted not to speak when called upon.
6. Fred DeMaio: Mr. DeMaio spoke in support of Resolution No. 236 – Fire Training Center.
7. Carole Preziosi, Rosendale: Ms. Preziosi President of the Association of Fire Districts of Ulster County spoke in support of Resolution No. 236 – Fire Training Center.
8. Steve Rice, Accord: Mr. Rice Chairman of the Trails Advisory Committee thanked everyone for their efforts supporting the programs.
9. Amanda Sisenstein, New Paltz: Ms. Sisenstein shared her input/experience using maps and the website provided for the UCAT/Kingston transportation merger.
10. Peter Criswell, Kingston: Mr. Criswell a resident of Kingston announced he will be running for the District 7, Ulster County Legislative seat expressing his concern with the bus transit merger.
11. Barbara Scott, Kingston: Ms. Scott spoke in opposition to Resolution No. 260, appointing Brad Will to the Ulster County Planning Board – City of Kingston.
12. Kate Reese Hurd, High Falls: Ms. Hurd strongly expressed concern linking lyme, zika, and leaky gut syndrome to electronic magnetic wireless radiation penetration - 5G usage exposure will only intensify negative health effects.
13. Ethan Scott Barnett, Kingston: Mr. Barnett a resident of Kingston announced he will be running for City of Kingston Mayor. Mr. Barnett opposes Brad Will's appointment to the UC Planning Board.
