- WHEREAS, Domestic violence is the leading cause of injury to women—more than car accidents, muggings, and rapes combined; and
- WHEREAS, Approximately 42.4 million women in the United States have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime; and
- **WHEREAS,** Everyday in the US, more than three women are murdered by their husbands or boyfriends; and
- **WHEREAS,** Studies suggest that up to 10 million children witness some form of domestic violence annually; and
- WHEREAS, Domestic abuse occurs within all age groups, ethnic backgrounds and income levels; and
- WHEREAS, Domestic violence consists of intimidation, physical assault, battery, sexual assault, rape, violence or other abusive behavior carried out by one intimate partner against another; and
- WHEREAS, There are resources available in Ulster County for victims of domestic violence and the members of their family; and
- **WHEREAS**, Awareness is the first step toward ending this cycle of violence in any household.
