TOPICS DISCUSSED



CYBER SAFETY

In a world of technology, it is more important than ever to make sure that teens are practicing online safety. This workshop will discuss many areas of cyber safety including content posting/sharing, meeting strangers online, technological boundaries, sexting and more. This class will allow teens to take a look at their own cyber usage and evaluate how safe they are being online.



HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS (BOUNDARIES, CONSENT & MORE)

A prevention education workshop focusing on teens who are starting to explore the world of relationships. Discussions of healthy boundaries, consent, and teen dating violence will be discussed, as well as community resources, and how to support a friend who has been the victim of a crime.



HUMAN TRAFFICKING 101

This workshop looks to provide youth with a brief overview of what human trafficking is. The discussions in this course will allow students to learn the red flags of human trafficking, how traffickers groom youth, and steps they can take to avoid interactions with potential traffickers. Community resources will also be provided.

WHY TEACH YOUTH THIS MATERIAL?

- **NEARLY 1.5 MILLION HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS NATIONWIDE EXPERIENCE PHYSICAL ABUSE FROM A DATING PARTNER EVERY YEAR.**

The numbers of youth who experience teen dating violence continues to rise every year. As youth enter the world of friendships and relationships it's more important than ever for them to understand what teen dating violence looks like and how to get help if they themselves or someone they know are experience teen dating violence.

- **NEARLY 1/4 OF TRAFFICKING VICTIMS ARE UNDER THE AGE OF 18**

Human Trafficking is happening in every state in the USA. Teenage years are often spent working to form an individual identity, while also attempting to gain acceptance from peers. The many vulnerabilities faced during teenage years can increase an individual's chances of being exploited by a trafficker. As cases of human trafficking continues to increase the important of teaching youth about the red flags of human trafficking also increases.
