Ulster County Health Department to Offer H1N1 Flu Vaccine At Public Clinics Free of Charge

Ulster County Executive Mike Hein and Health Department Director LaMar Hasbrouck, M.D., M.P.H., announced that the county will be offering **free** H1N1 flu vaccine clinics for county residents during the week of December 14th through 18th.

No appointments are necessary.

Governor David A. Paterson announced on December 10, 2009 in a press release that, “effective immediately, health care providers may make the H1N1 flu vaccine available to all New Yorkers who want the vaccine, including those who are not in priority groups established by the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

**Ulster County Health Department’s clinics are open to anyone
six months and older who want the vaccine.**
