Proposed Amendments to the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2020-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

The Ulster County Transportation Council (UCTC) has initiated a 15 day public comment period on the proposed amendments to the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2020-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Transportation Improvement Program

The TIP is a five-year capital program that assigns federal funds to transportation projects located in Ulster County. The proposed amendments to the TIP as follows:

- **Resolution 2020-05:** Amendment to revise NYSDOT PIN 881451 – Culvert replacements on state highways in the Town of New Paltz and Gardiner: Increase in funding to meet project needs.
- **Resolution 2020-06:** Amendment to add new NYSTA PIN 872070 – Pavement striping on I-87 and I-90: Addition to UCTC TIP.
