0:09:55.520,0:10:02.880 private carriers operating within the Ulster County area. Those funds were approved under,

0:10:13.120,0:10:19.280 need to approve a capital cost of contracting agreement. The New York State DOT

0:10:19.920,0:10:26.960 prefers that the capital cost of contracting is operated out of one MPO and they prefer that to be

0:10:26.960,0:10:34.880

Capital District Transit Authority operating out of Albany. Therefore resolution 2020-10

0:10:34.880,0:10:42.480 transfers our UCTC authority to do capital cost of contracting to CDTA.

0:11:53.520,0:11:58.880 our own management requirements which would have to run through the designated recipient 0:11:58.880,0:12:04.160 which in Ulster County which would be UCAT so it takes that responsibility off of them as well.
