EXPLOITATION Taking advantage of someone's vulnerability for personal benefit.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Safe Harbour Law: "Any person under 18 years of age who has been subject to sexual exploitation as a result of their loitering for the purpose of prostitution or their engagement in an offer to exchange sexual conduct in return for food, clothing, a place to stay, drugs, or a fee.'

2008 Safe Harbour for Exploited Children Act (8-A § 447A)

Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children: "Sexual abuse of a child (under the age of 18) by another person in return for something of value." CSEC includes child pornography. trafficking in children for sexual purposes, child sex tourism and child marriage when payment is exchanged.

Labor Trafficking: "The recruitment or obtaining a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of or subjection to involuntary servitude. 2000 Trafficking Victims Protection Act (22 USC § 7102)

Sex Trafficking: "Recruitment or soliciting of a person for the purposes of a commercial sex act, in which the commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion, or in which the person induced to perform such an act has not attained 18 years of age." 2000 Trafficking Victims Protection Act (22 USC § 7102)

FORCE Beatings, Confinement, Deprivation Isolation, Physical Restraint, Providing Drugs to Impair Judgement, Rape

FRAUD Debt Bondage, False Promises, Misleading Statements, Tricking, Withholding Government Documents

COERCION Blackmail, Guilt-Tripping, Humiliation, Monitored Activity, Pressuring, Intimidating, Threatening

SEXUAL ASSAULT Sexual contact or behavior that occurs without explicit consent of the victim.

RAPE Penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim.

CONSENT When someone agrees, gives permission, or says "yes" to sexual activity with other persons. All people in a sexual situation must feel that they are able to say "yes" or "no" or stop the sexual activity at any point.

SAFETY PLANNING Brainstorming ways to stay safe that may also help reduce the risk of future harm. It can include planning for a future crisis, considering your options, and making decisions about your next steps.
